Tractors that CAN NOT meet the following rules may pull in the OPEN FARM classes

TRACTORS MAY NOT PULL IN BOTH ANTIQUE AND OPEN CLASSES

1. No alterations to tires such as cut, shaved, road spun, grooved, etc.
2. Tractors must be equipped with stock pumps only.
3. No four wheel drive tractors allowed.
4. Weight includes driver. No weight or driver change after weigh-in.
5. Drawbar height maximum 18" from ground in ALL classes.
6. Drawbar must be equipped with a hitching device, not more than 1" in thickness and must have 3" diameter opening. Pulling point may not be more than 1 ½" from back edge of hitching device.
7. No tampering of hydraulic control of Drawbar while pulling.
8. Steel wheels permitted, no tire chains permitted. No dual wheels permitted.
9. Committee has the right to accept or reject all entries.
10. Contest to be governed by three (3) judges, with all decisions final.
11. Judges have the right to stop contestant's tractor if the tractor is being operated in an unsafe manner.
12. All minors must have written consent of parents or guardians to enter contest.
13. Only one pull allowed to each contestant, unless judges declare a tie. Pull is ended when tractor's engine stalls or excessive spinning occurs. No jerking allowed.
14. A member of the committee will check drawbar height prior to making pull.
15. Tractors may be rechecked after pull is made if there is any question of rule violation.
16. Contest winners to be decided by total distance pulled.
17. Tractors will be weighed prior to making pull and after pulling on portable scales on the grounds.
18. All weight must be securely fastened. Losing any weights while pulling is disqualification.
19. Contestants shall draw by lottery for pulling positions in each class.
20. Operators must remain seated during the pull and must have complete control of tractor at all times.
21. Positively only two adults (1driver, 1 helper) allowed in pits with each tractor entered.
22. Tractors may pull in two weight classes, but only once in each class.
23. Trophies will be given to winner of each class.

Tractors that CAN NOT meet the following rules may pull in the OPEN FARM classes

TRACTORS MAY NOT PULL IN BOTH ANTIQUE AND OPEN CLASSES

1. HELMET, FIRE JACKETS & LEATHER SHOES ARE RECOMMENDED
2. Does not need a working PTO
3. May or may not pull from stock drawbar. Wheelie bars required.
4. No tire chains permitted. No dual wheels permitted.
5. No four wheel drive tractors allowed.
6. Tractors may be equipped with any pump.
7. Weight includes driver. No weight or driver change after weigh-in.
8. Drawbar height maximum 18" from ground in ALL classes.
9. Drawbar MAY NOT BE less than 18" from center of axle, not more than 1" in thickness and must have a 3" diameter opening. Pulling point may not be more than 1 ½" from back edge of hitching device.
10. No tampering of hydraulic control of drawbar while pulling.
11. Judges have the right to stop contestant's tractor if the tractor is being operated in an unsafe manner.
12. All minors must have written consent of parents or guardians to enter contest.
13. Tractors may be rechecked after pull is made if there is any question of rule violations.
14. Contest winners to be decided by total distance pulled.
15. All weight must be securely fastened. Losing any weights while pulling is a disqualification.
16. Operators must remain seated during the pull, and must have complete control of the tractor at all times.
17. Positively only two adults (1 driver and 1 helper) are allowed in pits with each tractor entered.
18. Tractors may pull in two weight classes, but only once in each class.

Open Farm Stock Tractor Pull

Weight Class: 1. 6,000 lbs, 2. 7,500 lbs., 3. 9,500 lbs., 4. 11,500 lbs.

1. All tractors that have a high idle speed greater than that published in the A & W Dino Test Book, the Nebraska Tractor Test PTO Data, **WILL** pull in this class.
2. Tractors may pull in two classes but only once in each class.
3. A tachometer will be available to check engine speed.
4. Drawbar height in all classes will be 20".
5. All tractors in this division shall comply with the general rules, plus the following additional safety rules.
6. A bell-housing BLANKET with the following MINIMUM construction specifications:
 - a. Seventeen (17) inches wide and long enough to wrap around the bell housing with at least 6 inches of overlap.
 - b. Secures with six (6) 2-inch wide nylon web straps with a steel D-ring on one end and sewn the length of the blanket (except for the overlap area), and long enough to pass back through the D-ring and be tied in a saddle cinch.
 - c. Four (4) 2-inch nylon web retaining straps each at the front and back of the blanket.
7. Only mechanically activated clutches are permitted.
8. Turbo charged engines are required to have one cable that must surround the engine block and head. This cable must be placed between first and second cylinder through the exhaust manifold port area.
 - a. Cable must be a minimum of 3/8 inch thickness.
 - b. Cable must have a minimum of two clamps at the splice.
 - c. Cable must have four inches of slack.
9. Tractor must have side shield made of aluminum or steel, a minimum of 0.060 inches thick. This must be solid-engine mounts, filter, steering rods, etc. may not serve as part of the shield.
10. Tractor must have a metal deflection shield between the driver and engine from top of hood to top of torque tube or trans housing or clutch housing from side shield to side shield. This will also serve as a flash fire shield.
11. Tractor must use stock fuel for make and model of tractor. Water injection and or intercooler allowed. Use of gasoline and/or alcohol is prohibited.
12. Vehicle must have a complete firewall with no holes except for controls. Holes must not exceed ½ larger than controls passing through.
13. Tractor must have hood and grill in place as intended by manufacturer.
14. All tractors must have solid rear stabilizer (wheelie bars) that are strong enough to support the weight of the tractor. Jacking up of the tractor is the test.
15. Driver safety equipment is required as follows:
 - a. An approved driving helmet
 - b. Leather or fire-proof shoes – no leather sneakers.
16. Each tractor must be equipped with a minimum 2.5 pound dry-chemical fire extinguisher in good working order and within easy reach of the driver
17. Tractors must have an automatic ignition kill switch and/or shutoff.
 - a. Track officials and/or tech inspectors have the option of checking kill switches as many times as they feel adequate at any event.
 - b. Switch must be checked with engine running.
 - c. If there is any doubt as to whether the device is hooked up properly, the pulling vehicle will be started to check the kill switch.
 - d. Switch must be mounted independently on drawbar and/or wheelie bars.
 - e. Kill switch must be located in the rear center of the tractor (maximum of 6 inches off center in any direction), and 48 inches above point of hook.
 - i. Function of kill switch:
 - (1) On spark ignition engines, that kill switch must break or ground the ignition circuit.
 - (2) On tractors that have spark ignition engines and an electric fuel pump the kill switch must also break current to the fuel pump.
 - (3) On diesel engines, the kill cable must activate the air shutoff. No electric operated air shutoff.
18. A tech official from NTPA will be at the pull to inspect tractors.
19. Hitch fee is \$10.00.

Tractors that CAN NOT meet the following rules may pull in the OPEN FARM classes

TRACTORS MAY NOT PULL IN BOTH ANTIQUE AND OPEN CLASSES

1. All tractors that have a high idle SPEED EQUAL TO OR LESS THAN that published in the A & W Dino Test Book, the Nebraska Tractor Test PTO, **WILL** pull in this class.
2. No alterations to tires such as cut, shaved, road spun, grooved, etc.
3. Tractor must be equipped with stock pumps only.
4. No four wheel drive tractors allowed.
5. Weight includes driver. No weight or driver change after weigh-in.
6. Drawbar height maximum 18" from ground in 6,000 – 7,000 and 7,500 turbo classes.
7. Drawbar height maximum 20" from ground in 9,500 – 11,500 and 13,500 classes.
8. Drawbar must be equipped with a hitching device, not more than 1" in thickness and must have 3" diameter opening. Pulling point may not be more than 1 1/2" from the back edge of hitching device.
9. No tampering of hydraulic control of Drawbar while pulling.
10. Rubber tires only, no tire chains or dual wheels permitted.
11. Committee has the right to accept or reject all entries.
12. Contest to be governed by three (3) judges, with all decisions final.
13. Judges have the right to stop contestant's tractor if the tractor is being operated in an unsafe manner.
14. All minors must have written consent of parents or guardians to enter contest.
15. Only one pull allowed for each contestant, unless judges declare a tie. Pull is ended when tractor's engine stalls or excessive spinning occurs. No jerking allowed.
